You can't always trust what you get from the "trustworthy" web sites either. Here is an example of some sloppy cataloging from EbscoHost (Academic Search Complete). I was searching for an essay on Abraham Lincoln and found this one that was written by George Washington. I knew Washington was a bit of a miracle worker when it came to starting countries and winning wars, but who knew he was still writing in 1933. Curious, I redid my search with Washington as "author" just to double check. You can see my search terms and results in the screen capture. When I opened the article I found that someone (or some machine) has taken the first **section-title** from the essay and made that the author.
